Borough Councilperson. During her service, she served as part of a Democratic majority for the first time in borough history. She served many years as a Democratic committee woman for the borough and she was the first and only Democratic chair of the Susquehanna County Board of Commissioners.

Prior to being elected as County Commissioner in 2003, she served as executive director of the Susquehanna County Chamber of Commerce. Her community commitment was evident in the various capacities she served. She served as Cub Master, Lion's Club member, BPW member, New Milford Borough Parks Committee, Midtown Festival Committee, State Conservation Board member, County Library Board, Democratic Recognition picnic chair, and publicity chair of Blue Ridge Little League. She was a devoted mother to Brad and Matt and wife to Tom.

MaryAnn's passions were deep and varied. Her dogs were a true part of her family. She constantly supplied food donations to True Friends Animal Welfare Center.
